Attendance Policy

2019-2020 Phillip O. Berry Academy of Technology Grading Policy

The following grading policy was improved and works in conjunction with the existing CMS Grading Policy, which can be accessed online visiting our school website.

70% **Formal Assignment Expectations** minimum of 4 (semester classes)/ minimum of 8 for year (A/B classes)

- Late Penalty: -11 points each week late after the due date in PowerSchool (assessments and major projects)
- Assessments will be standards-based and measure mastery on specific learning objectives
- **Retest**: Following **required** additional practice assignment(s), new opportunities shall be provided to measure mastery. A maximum score of 79% can be earned. *The assignment/assessment/test will be different from the original formal assignment*
- Students will receive a 0 (zero) if they refuse to submit an assignment when present in class or school for the day (a makeup test will not be provided)
- Students will receive a 0 (zero) if the **honor code** is violated (cheating, plagiarism, etc.) a makeup assignment **will not** be provided

30% **Informal Assignment Expectations** (maximum of 15 per quarter)

- Late Penalty: If a student is absent (unexcused absence) from class up to 21 points (teacher discretion) will be deducted up to 5 school days after the due date in PowerSchool
- If a student is absent (excused) from class, 5 school days will be provided to submit the assignment without a penalty
- Assignments received after 5 school days will ONLY receive written feedback to support understanding of the standard
- Students will receive a 0 (zero) for informal assignments submitted 5 school days after the due date in PowerSchool
- Students will receive a 0 (zero) if they refuse to submit an assignment when present in class or school for the day (a makeup test will not be provided)
- Students will receive a 0 (zero) if the **honor code** is violated (cheating, plagiarism, etc.) a makeup assignment **will not** be provided

Grading Timeline

- Teachers will have 1 week (5 school days) to grade and enter in PowerSchool **projects** and **writing** tasks (essays)
- Teachers will have 72 hours (3 school days) to grade and enter online **multiple-choice** assessments

Teacher permission is required in advance to not attend class when present in school.

Late Work Policy

All assignments are expected to be submitted in a timely fashion. In order to receive full credit for work assigned during a determined week students will be required to submit their folders at the conclusion of said week. Students who choose not to submit folders on the assigned date will receive reduced credit for the assignments therein per the 2019-2020 Phillip O. Berry Academy of Technology Grading Policy. Furthermore, and again in the best interest of your student's development as a young and responsible adult, students will only have two weeks from the assigned submission date to receive credit for assignments. Should extenuating circumstances arise and your student is unable to attend school on the assigned submission date, you, the parent/guardian, would need to do the following to ensure that your student receives full credit.
